SPEAKER PRESENTATIONS

- Jon Gore Indigo Fishing Charters
 - Captain Jon Gore's upbringing in Georgia led to a lifelong love of fishing. He split his time guiding for trout on the Flathead River and numerous other iconic blue-ribbon trout streams in Montana and redfish in the Low Country of South Carolina before fully embracing the role of a full time fishing charter in Beaufort, SC.
- Rob Alexander Green Heron Adventures
 - O He has spent most of his life on the Carolina Coast and lives in Beaufort, SC where he runs charters full time. Bringing a variety of experiences and education to his guiding career, Rob is a lifelong angler, avid outdoorsman, served in the Marine Corps for eight years, graduated from Bob Jones University and NOLS Wilderness Guide School. He is also as a Coast Guard licensed and insured Master Captain.

These two guides did an excellent job of building enthusiasm among member to plan a fishing trip with them and other guides at the end of May, the guides indicated this was one of the best times for fishing the flats of Beaufort, SC.

They indicated it was a great destination with antebellum architecture and much to interest the wives of fishermen. They indicated it was like a small Charleston. It is close to Hilton Head and fly fishers are attracted to their area because of the huge amount of salt water streams to fish either by boat or wading. It encompasses 20% of the eastern seaboard marsh area. They have 8 foot tides since they are near the South Atlantic Bight. They have Red Fish occasional Cobia and Tarpon year round.

Dec.- Feb; Red fish are prominent in schools of hundreds. Best to be able to cast 40-50" for these, to keep a distance and not scare them off. Even though cold, it is a good time with less fishermen out.

Spring, March-May; Redfish and Sea Trout, this is a more difficult time because fish are finicky. April can be good.

May-August; Cobia come to spawn. End of May typically best, cobia 30-40". Red Fish come into Spartina Marsh Grasses and eat fiddler crabs, they display their tail as they dive for the crab. Can get closer to the fish, but should have accuracy. Best during flood tides as fish get further inland.

September-December; Time of the year when fish start moving on to warmer waters. Good time to fish because as they move through they are concentrating on eating to get fat for winter.

Both guides have skiffs that flat but wide for stability and can draft in only six inches. One has a Floyd Skiff and the other the last Chris Morejohn hand built in the area. Their contact information and you tube channel is below.
