TREASURERS REPORT

- Treasurer Doug Donaldson reported that the club's result from 2025 was close to breakeven; -\$4.41.

SPEAKER PRESENTATIONS

Jon Hooper General Manager – South Holston River Lodge, presented on fishing the Holston and Wautuga Rivers. The South Holston River Lodge was awarded the Orvis Endorsed Flyfishing Lodge of the Year for 2025. A number of club members have stayed at the lodge in the past and have been provided a quality experience. The lodge is approximately 400 miles from Southport with fishing in Tennessee. The South Holston Lake Dam controls the flow of water into the river. The water is released from the bottom of the lake which means it is cold and conducive for good fishing. There is an aerator at the outflow to oxygenate to flow. There are huge wild Brown trout that are from Boone Lake that are too smart to be easily caught, but there is always the chance. Otherwise there are young brown and rainbow trout.

Jon said they focus on teaching fly fishing to guests to be able to catch fish within all types of seasons and varying conditions. They are open all twelve months of the year. Some of his techniques are shown in to following images. He discussed streamer fishing. For fly casting he addressed using a slack line to work in the microcurrents. When using indicators he prefers Lefty Strike Indicators and fluorocarbon line. He also mentioned the use of New Zealand indicators. He stressed to always “set the hook” at the least indication.

He went through an large list of flies and said they are constantly adjusting the line depth and changing flies to make the catch. The flies he mentioned were: Mayhem, sweat thing, Frenchie, Hot Spot Softie, soft hackle, just add water, and for dry flies he likes the Puff Daddy. He likes to have a double dry fly set up. He also uses a simple cripple, Midges, scuds and sowbugs. Jon is an enthusiast on all the bugs /terrestrials that the fish like at different times of the year. He has pumped stomachs to learn specifics.

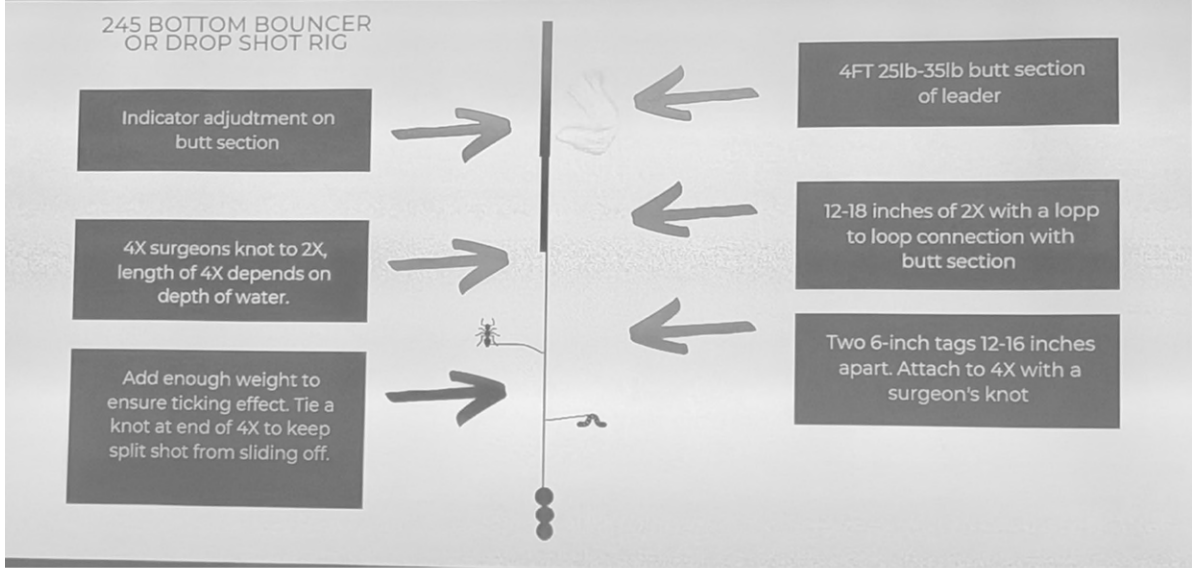

TECHNIQUES

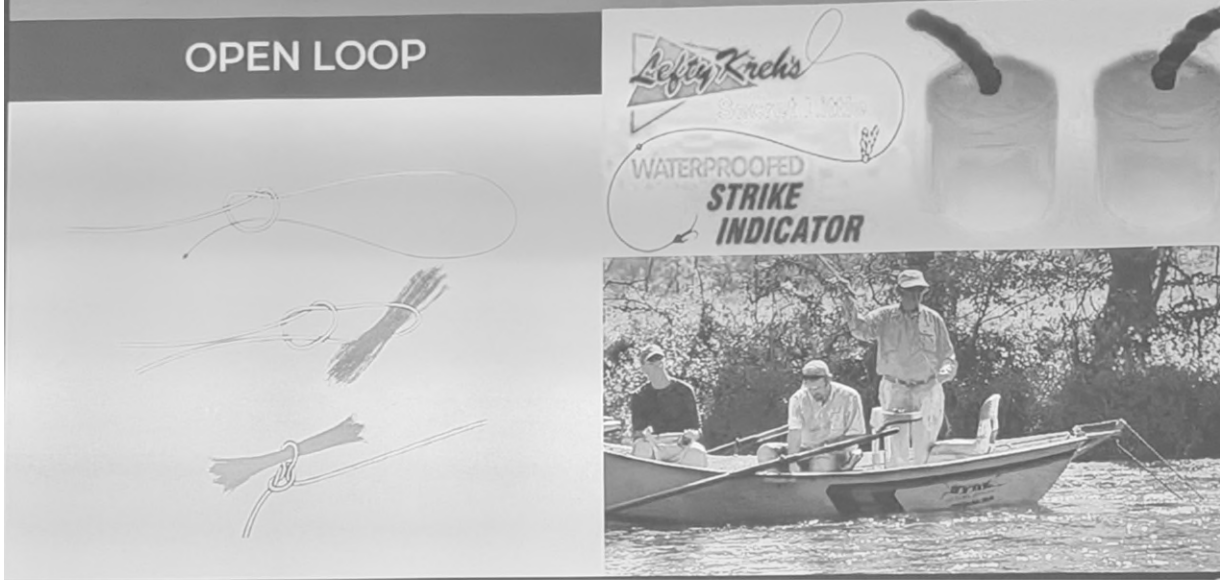
- High water fishing techniques
 - Bottom bouncer or drop shot rig
 - Traditional inline nymph rig with heavy weight
 - Streamer fishing
 - Dry fly fishing – 9-12ft leader
- Low water fishing techniques
 - Dry dropper
 - Light indicator setups
 - Dry fly fishing- 9-14ft leader
